The NGO Crossing Borders is internationally oriented. It has has been working with youth from all over the world since it was founded in 1999. Crossing Borders team is very international too with 25 staff, volunteers and interns from over 20 countries with different academic and professional backgrounds and experiences add to the international orientation of CB (Crossing Borders).

The majority of projects that Crossing Borders organize, coordinate or participate in are international. On an annual basis, Crossing Borders runs 10-15 international projects including youth exchanges, trainings both in EU and developing countries. Crossing Borders welcomes up to 5 European Voluntary Service (EVS) volunteers annually too. Moreover, Crossing Borders run Global School Services and aim at adding a global dimension to the school curriculum in Denmark as a contribution to the 2014 school reform. Through school services, CB brings the real world into the schools and the schools out into the world.

Internationalisation is the core of Crossing Borders. CB believes that in order to develop and implement a global agenda, it is necessary to incorporate people from different countries, cultures, backgrounds. This is done via a diverse Crossing Borders team (as mentioned before, 25 people from over 20 countries) and international youth exchanges and trainings (up to 15 international projects a year). Moreover, we have over 70 National Coordinators all over the world who are former CB workers, volunteers or partners with the aim to continue spreading Crossing Borders vision and mission.

Our organization Crossing Borders is making an effort to reduce our environmental impact and encourage sustainable consumption. We are trying to reduce our environmental impact within the organization including initiatives such as recycling, food sharing (to reduce food waste), not using single-use plastic, saving electricity and heating. In this way, we are encouraging each other to consider the environment and consume wisely.

The organization runs several local events, workshops and international projects on environmental protection and sustainability. For example, currently, we are organizing an event called 'Sustainable Christmas' which concerns anti-consumerism and waste reduction. Another example could be that we run school workshops and one of them is about Sustainable Development Goal 13 (Climate Action) where our facilitators teach students about sustainability and climate action. Moreover, we have run a number of international projects such as "EcoHub" (empowering young people to create eco-enterprises) or "Youth Climate Ambassadors" that encourage youth to consider the environment and take action.

As said before, our organization is not hierarchical; therefore, no one is higher or lower than one another. This is done via beforementioned staff and individual meetings as well as everyday work at the office and our communication platforms (e-mail, Facebook). We believe that everybody's viewpoint is valuable.

Generally, Crossing Borders is involved in activities regarding SDGs promotion such as 'Global Goals Cup', SDGs and Debate in Uganda or promoting SDGs within youth at Ungdommens Folkemøde (Youth Democracy Festival). To address SDG 1, Crossing Borders creates and, with the help of local funding possibilities, finances projects that are implemented in developing countries.

How did your organization address Goal 3? (min 350, max 800 characters)

We particularly try to focus on mental health at our organization. Being an NGO working with global issues, we understand the need for a strong mental health within and outside our organization. To achieve that, we focus on having open discussions, dialogues, promoting gratitude, solidarity and empathy both within ourselves and outside Crossing Borders.

How did your organization address Goal 4? (min 350, max 800 characters)

Crossing Borders provides learning opportunities, particularly for youth, through youth trainings and workshops. Formal education in Denmark is good quality but CB also offers non-formal Hojskole global studies and training courses in communication, conflict management, and media skills and publication of a youth magazine and educational materials for the dialogue creation which is very relevant in the current global situation.

How did your organization address Goal 5? (min 350, max 800 characters)

We provide opportunities regardless of a person's gender. We try to have a balance between female and male. Moreover, often we run activities connected to women empowerment, such as "Women Entrepreneurial Day". Added to that, the office that we work in is also the first mosque in Denmark for women with a female priest and weekly Friday prayings which add to gender equality as well.

How did your organization address Goal 8? (min 350, max 800 characters)

We provide decent work conditions and flexible hours for our team. We also have capacity building and trainings to provide opportunities for the team to develop their skills and capabilities. We also promote and provide space for feedback for staff on how to improve our working conditions and do our best towards meeting them. In the work enwironment, everybody's opinions are appreciated and everybody is involved in the decision making process.

How did your organization address Goal 10? (min 350, max 800 characters)

We have an inclusive policy, meaning that at our organization we don't discriminate people based on their gender, religious beliefs, ethnicity, background, sexual orientation. Everybody has the same chances and opportunities. We also do not discriminate people in our projects, everybody is welcome to join them and learn. In this way, we aim to reduce the inequalities gap and to give the same chances to success to everyone.

This is done within the organization and outside. We encourage each other to consume responsibly, not to waste food and other materials, recycle. We also have organized several events on responsible consumption, zero waste, upcycling workshops, clothes' and books' swaps and other, we constantly invite experts, business representatives and other initiatives to give speeches and share their knowledge.

Climate change and sustainability is one of our main themes within the organization. We have developed a number of projects connected to climate action, such as EcoHub - empowering young people to create ecoenterprises; Youth Climate Ambassadors - empowering youth climate leaders to advocate for their environmental rights and many more. We have also participated in People's Climate March and run a school workshop in Danish schools, particularly on this SDG.

One of our core objectives is peace and justice for all as well as inclusive society, particularly youth empowerment and active citizenship. We have a number of projects related to dialogue, peace building, youth empowerment, promotion of active and inclusive participation in the society.

We also run a school workshop in Danish schools, particularly on this SDG.

Creating strong partnerships with other organizations is one of our top priorities. We always work in collaboration with local and international organisations that have similar objectives and values. Moreover, we develop and participate in Erasmus+ KA1, KA2 and KA3 projects and, particularly for this SDG, KA2 strategic partnership projects that are transnational projects designed to develop and share innovative practices and promote cooperation.
